**If You Received A Call From Nissan Motor Acceptance Corporation On Your Cellular Telephone By Means Of An Automatic Telephone Dialing System And/Or An Artificial Or Prerecorded Voice, And You Were Not A Party To Any Contract With Nissan Motor Acceptance Corporation, You Could Receive A Payment From A Class Action Settlement.**

A settlement has been reached in a class action lawsuit alleging that Nissan Motor Acceptance Corporation (“NMAC”) violated the Telephone Consumer Protection Act by using an automatic telephone dialing system and/or an artificial or prerecorded voice to initiate calls to cell phones of non-customers without their prior express consent. NMAC denies these allegations.

**Who is included?** You are included in the Settlement if NMAC placed one or more non-emergency telephone calls to your cell phone with equipment that constitutes or may constitute an automatic telephone dialing system, as well as artificial or prerecorded voice calls, between March 24, 2012 and October 3, 2019, and you were not a party to any agreement with NMAC (“Settlement Class Members”).

**What does the Settlement provide?** NMAC has agreed to pay \$2,200,000, which will be used to create a Settlement Fund to make payments to Settlement Class Members who submit a valid and timely claim, pay Class Counsel’s attorneys’ fees and costs, pay a service award to each Class Representative, and pay settlement administration costs. While dependent upon the number of claims filed, Class Counsel estimates Settlement Class Members’ payments may be within the range of \$50 to \$100.

**How do I get a payment?** You must complete and submit a Claim Form by **July 15, 2022**. Claim Forms may be submitted online at [www.TerteryanTCPASettlement.com](http://www.TerteryanTCPASettlement.com) or printed from the website and mailed to the address on the form.

**What are my other options?** If you are included in the Settlement and do nothing, your rights will be affected and you won’t get a payment. If you don’t want to be legally bound by the Settlement, you must exclude yourself from it by **June 17, 2022**. Unless you exclude yourself, you won’t be able to sue or continue to sue NMAC for any claim made in this lawsuit or released by the Settlement Agreement. If you stay in the Settlement (i.e., don’t exclude yourself), you may object to it or ask for permission for you or your lawyer to appear and speak at the hearing—at your own cost—but you don’t have to. **The Court’s hearing.** The Court will hold a hearing in this case (*Terteryan, et al. v. Nissan Motor Acceptance Corp.*, Case 2:16-cv-02029) at 8:30 a.m. on **August 22, 2022** at the United States District Court for the Central District of California, 350 West 1st Street, Suite 4311, Los Angeles, California 90012-4565. At the hearing, the Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement, Class Counsel’s request for attorneys’ fees and costs (\$775,000), and a service award to each Class Representative (\$10,000).
